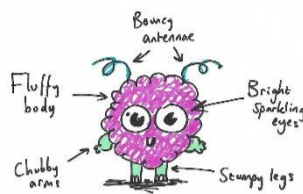
Reading

Answer these questions:
 1. Which animals do the Bunnies meet?
 2. How do the Bunnies meet at the end of the story? Why?
 3. How were the bunnies feeling when they saw the wolf? Why?

Draw your own story map of *We're going on an Egg Hunt*. Which animals do you need to draw? In what order?

Read one of your favourite books with an adult and draw your favourite character. Label it or write a sentence about it.



Listen to the Tale of *Peter Rabbit* By Beatrix Potter [Link](#)

Answer these questions:
 1. What does Peter's mummy tell him not to do?
 2. What happens when Peter is in the garden?
 3. How does Peter feel when he's stuck in the garden? Why?

Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story. Why was this your favourite part?

Writing

Which animals do the bunnies see on their adventure? Write a sentence to tell us about the animals: 'They saw some sheep.' You could try to add a describing word: 'They saw fluffy sheep.'

Design a most wanted poster for the wolf. Write some words to describe how he looks. Think about his eyes, his teeth, his claws.

Draw a picture of Peter Rabbit. Draw it carefully make sure you give him 2 long ears, a little nose, 2 beady eyes, long whiskers and don't forget his little blue coat and shoes.

How many words can you think of to describe Peter Rabbit? Think about how he looks and how he acts. Write these words around your Peter Rabbit picture.

Draw and label a menu for the bunnies we've been reading about this week. Think about the foods they eat – lettuce, carrots, etc. Listen to your Peter Rabbit story again for ideas.

Spring!

These activities you do with your families... it's all about spring!

- **Research** - what is Easter and how do you celebrate it.
- Use some empty eggshells broken in half or with the top off, draw a face on them and put damp cotton wool into the bottom. Add some cress seeds. Keep the cotton wool nice and moist and see what happens.
- Blow the yolks out of some eggs and decorate them.
- Use forks to print your own flower pictures.
- **Build a rabbit burrow.** Think about the bear caves we've built, use fabric to create the roof and walls. Don't forget to add lots of comfy things to the bottom of your burrow to make the 'rabbits' comfy and warm.
- Why not **visit** some local woods?
