Thank you to the 61 parents who responded to our survey.

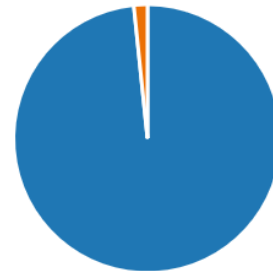
- The feedback was very positive with 98% of parents agreeing that RSHE is an important part of the primary curriculum. 89% of parents felt that our draft policy fully meets it's aims and only 11% felt that it was only able to partially do this.
