SMART RULES FOR USING THE INTERNET

S is for SAFE

Never give out personal information if you are chatting or posting online.

Personal information:-

your name
your school
where you live
email address
phone number
passwords

SMART RULES FOR USING THE INTERNET

M is for MEETING

Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents' or carers' permission and even then only when they can be present. Remember online friends are still strangers even if you have been talking to them for a long time.

SMART RULES FOR USING THE INTERNET

A is for ACCEPTING

Accepting emails, IM messages, or opening files, pictures or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems - they may contain viruses or nasty messages!

SMART RULES FOR USING THE INTERNET

R is for RELIABLE

Someone online might lie about who they are. Information on the internet may not be true. Always check information with other websites, books or someone who knows. If you like chatting online it is best to only chat to your real world friends and family

SMART RULES FOR USING THE INTERNET

T is for TELL

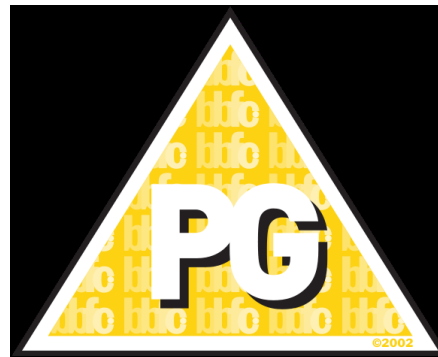
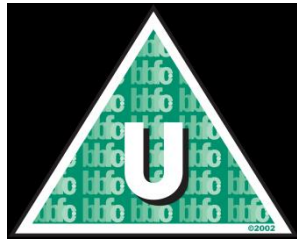
Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online.

- When sending an email only say nice things to others
